Hurricane Helene Response

We have had an outpouring of support from our community in response to the hurricane. On October 3, 2024, we distributed emergency food from 9:00am - 12:00pm. During that time frame, we gave away 101 bags of shelf stable food items.

Understandably, that volume of need depleted our food pantry's supplies. We sent out a large wish list of items to restock the food pantry to our volunteers and member churches, who responded with several truckloads of much-needed supplies!

Our pantry was ready to serve more people in our community in no time!

Partner Organizations

Community Ministry of North Augusta has expanded its partnerships, which allows for collaboration between agencies to better serve our community.

CMONA has partnered with the following agencies because we believe that people with substance use issues, mental illnesses, trauma and others who have experienced severe emotional distress, are often the object of misunderstanding and stigmatizing attitudes. Much of the homelessness and poverty that we encounter is a direct result of substance use or mental health issues.

Each of these agencies along with CMONA have pledged to treat each client with respect and dignity. We provide safe and therapeutic environments that promote self-sufficiency. We offer a hand up, not a handout.



Aiken-Barnwell Mental Health

The mission of Aiken-Barnwell Mental Health is to support the recovery of people with mental illnesses. Each person receiving services is treated with respect and dignity. ABMHC believes that people are best serviced in or near their homes. Through our partnership, clients can be referred to ABMHC for immediate evaluation and assessment.

Aiken Center

This expansion will enable Aiken Center to offer substance use treatment and recovery support services to the North Augusta area. It is our hope that we as a ministry, in partnership with Aiken Center, can engage families and walk with them through their recovery journey.

Courage Center

A peer recovery support specialist is housed in the ministry building and sees clients by appointment. The coach works with recovering individuals to help them develop and follow a structured recovery plan. They can serve as a liaison to “recovery capital” such as employment, housing, and health care. The focus of long-term peer recovery support goes beyond the reduction or elimination of symptoms to encompass self-actualization, community and civic engagement, and overall wellness.

Cumbee Center

Community Ministry of North Augusta continues its partnership with The Cumbee Center to assist abused persons. The mission of The Cumbee Center is to support and empower domestic violence victims, sexual violence victims, and their families. Clients in the North Augusta area are seen by appointment.

Rural Health Services – Clyburn Center for Primary Care

The mission of Rural Health Services is to provide accessible, quality, comprehensive primary healthcare services in a dignified and culturally competent manner.

La-Z-Boy Home Furnishings & Décor selected CMONA as one of their seven charity partners. During their Trade-In Sale, the company raises around \$22,000 each year for their charity partners and sends 7 to 10 truckloads of gently used furniture donations to organizations that help people in need.
